

EVERYTHING ABOUT WASTE SEGREGATION



How to segregate?

If you do not know how to do it correctly or there are doubts, this Guide to the rules of handling municipal waste in the KZGRL is made just for you.

The main principle of the Common Waste Segregation System (WSSO), which is related to the unification of waste segregation rules throughout the country, is the separation of raw materials from non-recyclable waste. Separate collection of paper, glass, plastics together with metals, as well as the separation of bio-waste, make it possible to obtain the most valuable raw materials for recycling.

Residents of member municipalities segregate waste

into 5 fractions,

which are collected directly from the property:



CLEAR GLASS



COLOURED GLASS



PAPER



PLASTICS AND METALS



BIODEGRADABLE WASTE

In addition, the above-mentioned fractions and other segregated municipal waste are collected from residents at the Municipal Selective Waste Collection Points.



You can also get rid of bulky waste and used electrical and electronic equipment during round trips. This waste is collected according to the schedule in front of the property. During the round trips, you do not collect post-renovation waste, mirrors or window panes. The schedule is available on our website www.kzgrl.pl

BIO WASTE

Principles of gathering and collecting bio-waste on the premises of KZGRL

In the area of the Municipal Union of Municipalities of the Leszno Region, from January 2020, a new brown container for bio-waste is added to the blue, yellow, green and white containers and bags.

Bio-waste can be collected in a household composter. Property owners who do not have a composter are required to equip their property with a brown bio-waste bin.

Bio-waste will be collected only from containers intended for this purpose - in brown and with the word BIO.

The excess of bio-waste, such as grass, leaves or branches, which do not fit into the brown container, can be returned in any amount to the Municipal Selective Waste Collection Points.



- ✓ Vegetable and fruit waste,
- ✓ food scraps (excluding meat and bones),
- ✓ egg shells, coffee and tea grounds,
- ✓ fruit and vegetable peels



- ✓ grass,
- ✓ leaves and weeds,
- ✓ cut flowers and potted flowers,
- ✓ shredded branches.



REMEMBER!

In brown containers, bio-waste should be collected in bulk or in biodegradable bags.

WE DO NOT THROW IN:

- × liquid kitchen waste,
- × bones, bones and meat,
- × soil and stones,
- × ash,
- × animal excrements





CLEAR GLASS

WE THROW:

- ✓ clear glass bottles
- ✓ clear glass jars
- ✓ glass cosmetic packaging



COLOURED GLASS

WE THROW:

- ✓ stained glass bottles
- ✓ stained glass jars
- ✓ glass packaging (e.g. for cosmetics)



PLASTICS AND METALS

WE THROW:

- ✓ plastic bottles
- ✓ caps, food cans
- ✓ beverage cartons (e.g. Tetrapak)
- ✓ plastic bags
- ✓ cleaning products and cosmetics packaging
- ✓ plastic pots, packaging for coffee
- ✓ sweets, chips
- ✓ aluminium foil packaging
- ✓ packaging for food



REMEMBER!

Do not break the glass before throwing it into the container. Throw away without content. Throw caps into plastics and metals (yellow container or bag).



REMEMBER!

Empty, unscrew and crush before discarding.



WE DO NOT throw in:

- × pottery, pots, porcelain
- × table glass, crystals
- × faience, windows, mirrors
- × lamps and light bulbs
- × candles with wax
- × spectacle and heat-resistant glasses
- × thermometers
- × packaging for medicines
- × oils and solvents



WE DO NOT throw in:

- × bottles and containers with their contents
- × packages and bottles for oils
- × lubricants and cooling fluids
- × packaging for fertilizers and plant protection products
- × cans for varnishes and paints
- × wet films
- × plastic post-repair waste (e.g. moldings, paneling, etc.)
- × car parts
- × accumulators and batteries
- × household appliances and rtv



PAPER

WE THROW:

- ✓ newspapers, magazines
- ✓ books, notebooks
- ✓ leaflets, school and office paper
- ✓ cartons and cardboard
- ✓ wrapping paper,
- ✓ paper rolls and bags



BIODEGRADABLE WASTE

WE THROW:

- ✓ vegetable and fruit waste
- ✓ food scraps (excluding meat and bones)
- ✓ egg shells
- ✓ coffee and tea grounds
- ✓ fruit and vegetable peels
- ✓ grass
- ✓ leaves and weeds
- ✓ cut flowers and potted flowers
- ✓ shredded branches



MIXED WASTE

WE THROW:

- ✓ hygiene articles
- ✓ dirty paper towels
- ✓ greasy and dirty paper
- ✓ contaminated food packaging
- ✓ disposable razors
- ✓ table glass, crystals
- ✓ faience and porcelain
- ✓ items made of rubber and latex
- ✓ broken toys
- ✓ shoes and cloths,
- ✓ meat, bones, ash
- ✓ packaging polystyrene
- ✓ grave candles with wax



REMEMBER!

Throw away the packaging empty and crushed, dispose of paper towels and tissues as mixed waste.



WE DO NOT throw in:

- × beverage cartons (e.g. Tetrapak)
- × wet or greasy paper
- × waxed paper
- × packaging for construction materials (cement, mortars)
- × wallpapers
- × photo papers and photographs
- × hygiene items (cotton pads, sanitary napkins, disposable diapers, tissues)
- × receipts



REMEMBER!

In brown containers, bio-waste should be collected in bulk or in biodegradable bags.



WE DO NOT throw in:

- × liquid kitchen waste
- × bones, bones and meat
- × soil and stones
- × ash
- × animal excrements



REMEMBER!

Do not put waste collected selectively into the mixed waste container, the ashes should always be cooled down.



WE DO NOT throw in:

- × batteries and accumulators
- × expired medicines,
- × chemicals
- × adhesives, greases and oils
- × energy-saving fluorescent lamps and LED bulbs
- × mercury thermometers,
- × tires
- × debris, electrical waste

SELECTIVE COLLECTION OF MUNICIPAL WASTE

In all member communes of the Municipal Union of Municipalities of the Leszno Region, there are Selective Collection of Municipal Waste Points, to which each resident can deliver and leave their municipal waste free of charge*.

* The exception is post-renovation, construction and demolition waste. Per one resident of the property, max. 100 kg/year. For post-renovation waste exceeding the weight of waste specified in the limit, the property owner is obliged to pay the entrepreneur running the PSZOK.

**Selective Collection of Municipal Waste = Punkt Selektrywnego Zbierania Odpadów Komunalnych (PSZOK)

HOW EASY IS IT TO GET RID OF PROBLEM WASTE?

Find a Selective Municipal Waste Collection Point which is the most convenient for you to reach and bring segregated municipal waste. PSZOK is self-service, and employees will show you a place where waste is collected selectively, such as:

- ✓ Medicines – unused, out-of-date
- ✓ Chemicals – detergents, solvents, paints, inks, printing inks, adhesives, binders and resins, acids, alkalis, photographic reagents, plant protection chemicals
- ✓ Waste batteries and accumulators
- ✓ Waste containing mercury – fluorescent lamps and other waste containing mercury, e.g. energy-saving bulbs, fluorescent lamps, mercury thermometers
- ✓ Flat glass – window and door panes
- ✓ Worn tires – tires from bicycles, prams, mopeds, motorcycles and vehicles with a maximum permissible weight of up to 3.5 tons. Up to 4 tires from one property at a time
- ✓ Bio-waste – grass, leaves and weeds, small twigs, potted flowers, food remains of plant origin, fruit and vegetable remains, cut flowers
- ✓ Construction and demolition waste – brick and concrete debris, ceramics, tar paper, polystyrene (free of charge max. 100 kg per year per inhabitant)
- ✓ Bulky waste – furniture, large toys, carpets, bicycles
- ✓ Waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) – all devices whose proper operation depended on the supply of electricity from the mains, batteries or accumulators: TV sets, monitors, computers, washing machines, hair dryers, etc.
- ✓ Sorted waste collected from the property (paper, glass, plastics and metals)



PSZOK does not accept the following types of waste:

- ✗ Mixed municipal waste
- ✗ Wastes containing asbestos
- ✗ Car parts (e.g. windows, bumpers, headlights, body parts)
- ✗ Tires from trucks and agricultural machinery
- ✗ Unmarked waste, without the possibility of reliable identification (no labels)
- ✗ Waste in leaking packaging
- ✗ Construction equipment and industrial equipment
- ✗ Post-production waste, including agricultural waste

The PSZOKs do not accept waste from economic activity, including farm waste, e.g. tractor and truck tires, silage foil and hazardous waste like eternit.

The PSZOK service staff

has the right to refuse to accept the delivered waste in the event of finding:

- ✗ Contamination in the delivered waste
- ✗ No possibility of identifying hazardous waste
- ✗ Sources of non-household waste (e.g. non-household chemicals), especially in large quantities



REMEMBER:

Waste in the form of used electronic and electrical equipment must be delivered to PSZOK in the condition in which its use ended.

Hazardous waste, such as chemical substances, batteries and accumulators, paints, varnishes, solvents, fluorescent lamps and energy-saving bulbs, adhesives, used oils and greases, expired drugs should be delivered in original packaging, which will enable their correct identification.

GOOD ADVICE ON WASTE

1. Adjust the size of the container to your needs – waste that does not fit in the container, placed in the bags left next to it, will not be collected.
2. Keep the bags and waste containers in front of the property, on schedule, until 6:00 AM.
3. Remember to collect roundabouts of bulky rainfall and electronic waste. Check the collection schedule at www.kzgrl.pl and use it.
4. Large packages (e.g. cardboard boxes and foil) should be taken to PSZOK, do not leave them next to the container
5. Mark the containers permanently so that they can be identified by the company collecting the waste – details can be found at www.kzgrl.pl
6. DECLARATION – submit within 14 days of living on the property or from the moment of municipal waste arising on the property.
7. CHANGE OF DECLARATION – each time changing the declaration (e.g. in the case of a change in the number of people living in your property - death/birth/moving etc.), remember to submit a new declaration by the 10th day of the month following the month in which the change took place.
8. Batteries contain toxic substances, throw them into special containers that are found, for example, in offices, schools, shops, or you can take them to the PSZOK.
9. Use reusable bags when shopping. A disposable bag is an additional cost and waste that takes over 100 years to decompose.
10. Avoid products packed in multiple layers of packaging.



DO NOT POISON YOURSELF
AND YOUR NEIGHBOURS –
DO NOT BURN WASTE



By burning waste, you expose yourself not only to loss of health, but also to serious financial losses. Because it is harmful to the chimney flues, in which the so-called wet soot settles. It can catch fire and damage the chimney or even start a fire. By burning waste in your home stove, you produce and release dioxins and furans into the atmosphere - the most dangerous chemical compounds responsible for:

- × Increased risk of cancer, respiratory and cardiovascular diseases
- × Bothersome allergies and skin changes
- × Irritation of the conjunctiva of the eye and mucous membranes
- × Recurring headaches and much more

**By burning waste, you don't
get rid of the problem!**

**BY SMOKING WASTE
YOU CREATE A PROBLEM!**

Don't expect poisons to disappear in the smoke. Most of them are heavy and fall no more than a dozen metres from your chimney.
